WHAT IS F-CLASS SHOOTING?

- Shooting at a target 300 to 1000 meters away,
- Named after George ,Farky' Farquharson,
- •European F-class competitions take place in Italy, Eastern Europe, Balkans, etc.,

•European competitors use the same equipment as American ones, but there are some differences in the targets used,

•The goal is to shoot a tight group of 15–20 shots.



RIFLES USED IN F-CLASS SHOOTING

- •Two types of competitions Open and Target,
- •The rules listed below apply mostly to the European F-class competitions.

Open

- Calibers up to .35;
- Rifles weight up to 10 kg;
- It is allowed to shoot using a rest.

Target

- •Use of standard military calibers (.223 Rem., 5.56x45mm NATO, .308 Win., etc.);
- The maximum allowed mass is 8.25 kg;
- •Use of a bipod is allowed, the use of a rest is not.



GENERAL FEATURES OF F-CLASS RIFLESCOPES

- •F-class a long-range precision shooting discipline,
- •The turrets are either capped or not,
- •Fine clicks,
- Great tracking capability,
- •SFP-reticle,
- Thin reticle,
- •A big maximum magnification (above 30x).



LIGHT RIFLESCOPES FOR F-CLASS RIFLES

- •The competitors want to have as much of the allowed mass as possible in the rifle the riflescope has to be light,
- •30 mm tube,
- Objective lens diameter of 52 mm,
- •A weight of less than 800 grams for a riflescope,
- •The elevation range is limited because of the narrow tube,
- March and Nightforce among the first manufacturers of such riflescopes.

F-CLASS SHOOTING WITH TACTICAL RIFLESCOPES

- •Some shooters consider buying a MIL/MIL or MOA/MOA riflescope we do not recommend this,
- Tactical riflescopes are meant to hit any part of the target at any distance;
- •F-class riflescopes are meant for making precise, tight shot groupings on a known distance with possible test shots.

- Tactical riflescopes are not suitable for f-class because of:
 - Thick reticle
 - Big click value
 - Low maximum magnification
